

Minor in Entrepreneurship [4.0 credits]

This pamphlet is only a guide. Consult both your academic audit and the Carleton University Undergraduate Calendar (www.carleton.ca/cuuc) for specific rules that apply to your program.

Minor in Entrepreneurship: is an option designed for students registered in degree programs other than the Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of International Business. The minor can be earned through successful completion of 4.0 credits specified in the table. On successful completion of all requirements, the designation “Minor in Entrepreneurship” will be noted on the students transcript and diploma.

Eligibility for the Minor in Entrepreneurship: Only students pursuing undergraduate programs (except B.Com and BIB) requiring at least 20.0 credits to graduate and who have completed a least 4.0 credits towards their degree, with a minimum overall CGPA of 7.0, may be admitted to the Minor in Entrepreneurship.

Prerequisites: BUSI 2800 (C-)

BUSI 3810 - Business Development

Prerequisites: BUSI 2800 (C-)

BUSI 3820 - Practicum in Business Design

Prerequisites: BUSI 2800 (C-)

BUSI 4810 - Practicum in Business Creation

Prerequisites: BUSI 3820 and permission of the School of Business (students must submit a registration override)

Please Note:

If you plan on taking two Minors in Business: (e.g. the Minor in Entrepreneurship and the Minor in Business or the Minor in Arts Management) only 2.0 credits can double count between the two Minors.
